NANCY J. ADLER is a Professor of International Management at McGill University, Montreal, Canada. She received her B.A. in economics, M.B.A. and Ph.D. in management from the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA).

Presentation Overview: At the opening of the twenty-first century, the very nature of leadership in the world is changing. One of the most significant changes is that an increasing number of women are assuming the most senior level leadership positions in countries and companies worldwide. Among political leaders, for example, over 60 percent of women who have ever served their country as president or prime minister have come to office within just the last decade. Similarly, the number of women leading *Fortune 500* firms is increasing. In this session, we will look at the changing nature of global leadership and the increasingly prominent role of women in business and government. What do these changes mean for our global society? For our companies? And for the very nature of global leadership?
