The Department of Biology at Case Western Reserve University invites applications for two Instructor appointments for the 2013 -2014 academic year. The successful applicant will have responsibilities in the areas of teaching (including student advising) and service. Teaching duties will include responsibilities for introductory biology laboratory courses. Successful applicants should also be able to teach elective courses in a specialty area (physiology, anatomy, ecology, or genetics).

The positions require knowledge and experience in conducting and supervising college-level, inquiry-based laboratory experiments in either the fields of development and physiology (one position), or cell and molecular biology and ecology (one position). Both of the positions will include responsibilities for training and managing graduate and undergraduate teaching assistants. The development and physiology position will require familiarity with experiments involving embryonic development, neurophysiology, cardiophysiology, skeletal muscle physiology, respiratory physiology and osmoregulation. Ability to work with live animals and a knowledge of IACUC animal protocol regulations are essential. Familiarity of Powerlab software by AD instruments or its equivalent is desirable. Minimum requirements are PhD degree and prior experience as sole instructor of college lecture and/or laboratory courses.

Electronic applications (current curriculum vitae, and a letter that describes teaching interests and experience) should be submitted to Christopher Cullis, cac5@case.edu, Chair, Department of Biology. Candidates should arrange to have three letters of recommendation sent directly to the same email address with hard copies sent to Dr. Christopher Cullis, Department of Biology, Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, OH 44106-7080. Applications should be received by July 17, 2013 to receive full consideration.
