Case Western Reserve University invites applications for Assistant Professor of Music Education. CWRU's Department of Music is characterized by a distinguished, active, and innovative faculty, and by outstanding undergraduate and graduate students.

Applicants must have a completed doctoral degree in Music Education and three years of successful public school teaching experience, a distinguished record of scholarship relative to career stage, and a commitment to continued research, teaching, publication, service, and creative activity. Duties will include undergraduate and graduate courses in Music Education (methods classes, assessment, etc.), courses in area of expertise, along with active participation in the administration of the Music Education program at graduate and undergraduate levels. The expected teaching load is two courses per semester.

The CWRU Department of Music offers BA, BS, MA, MAL, DMA, and PhD degrees in a full range of specialties in Musicology and Music Education, with special programs in Historical Performance Practice, Popular Music, and research in Music Education. Departmental Guidelines call for senior faculty to show outstanding success in scholarship, teaching, mentoring, and service, with an international reputation in the respective discipline.

The Joint Music Program with the Cleveland Institute of Music is an integrated music program at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Students at CWRU and CIM have the benefit of pursuing studies at both schools, thus enjoying the benefits of both a conservatory and a major research university. Music history and music education courses are all taught at CWRU. The two institutions share a campus setting in University Circle, together with The Cleveland Orchestra, the Cleveland Museum of Art, and several other cultural organizations. Collaborations also exist with Cleveland's Rock & Roll Hall of Fame and Museum and its Library & Archives, The Music Settlement of Cleveland, and area schools.
