

Islamic Studies

The Department of Religious Studies at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, OH, invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of assistant professor with expertise in the academic study of Islam. All areas of specialization will be considered. Knowledge of appropriate research languages is required. The normal teaching load is two courses per semester.

The successful candidate will teach courses in Islamic studies as well as in theory and method in the academic study of religion. Candidates will be expected to have been awarded a Ph.D. by the time of appointment. Appointment will be in accord with the CWRU Faculty Handbook and the guidelines of the Department of Religious Studies.
