

The Department of Psychological Sciences in the College of Arts and Science at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU) invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of assistant professor. All applicants under consideration must hold a Ph.D. or equivalent by date of appointment and will be expected to develop a strong externally-funded research program, contribute to the department's undergraduate and graduate educational programs, and provide service that supports the strategic plans of the department, college, and university. The typical teaching requirement is 2 courses each semester.

The Department of Psychological Sciences houses the combined strengths of Psychology and Communication Sciences. The department offers undergraduate majors and minors in psychology and in communication sciences; a minor in health communications; an accredited M.A. program in speech-language pathology; an accredited Ph.D. program in clinical psychology; a Ph.D. program in communication sciences; and a Ph.D. program in experimental psychology. The ideal applicant's area of research will involve and integrate topics important for both psychology and communication sciences to enhance the research and education missions of the department. All relevant areas of expertise will be considered including developmental language sciences and disorders (infant through older adults) and aspects of cognitive aging.

Candidates should provide a letter of application, a curriculum vitae, a statement of research interests and plans, a statement of teaching experience, and the names, addresses, and email addresses of four referees to whom we may write.
