Juan Antonio García Borrero is the most prominent critic of current Cuban cinema, and a scholar, professor and author of nine books on the topic. Six times, he has earned the highest national distinction awarded to film critics in Cuba. He has been invited to the United States on numerous occasions to participate in talks, discussions and conferences at universities, including Harvard, Tulane, Rice and many other top institutions.



His visit is the first step toward the creation of a repository of Cuban cinema at Case Western Reserve University (thanks to the support of a Nord grant from UCITE). This step is a first stage of many others to be taken to enhance and promote Hispanic studies at Case Western Reserve.
