



Case gets web-learning grant

Case Western Reserve University has received a three-year, \$205,000 grant to create international learning experiences for students using web- or video-based technologies.

The McGregor Fund-endowed grant will help establish a Worldwide Learning Environment program at Case to "encourage faculty exchanges, as well as sustained collaborations between Case and institutions around the globe," according to a Case statement.

Through the initiative, students can "attend" overseas lectures, participate in seminars with peers at foreign universities, and engage in other interactive learning opportunities via webcast or videoconference.

This fall, Case faculty members can submit proposals to Worldwide Learning Environment's faculty advisory committee to use the grant money towards trips to establish or formalize international collaboration, for visits by international scholars serving as lecturers or co-teachers, or other technology-based interactions.

Case expects to use the money to fund as many as 10 projects each year, the statement said.
