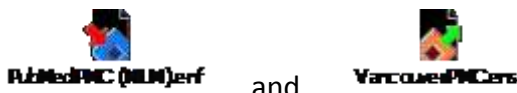


EndNote, Government Grants & PMCID's

Along with this explanatory document, there are two files:



The .enf file should be pasted into the FILTERS folder of EndNote. Double click [here](#) , you will be prompted with a FILE DOWNLOAD window, SAVE into the FILTERS Folder of EndNote.

The .ens file should be pasted into the STYLES folder of EndNote. Double click [here](#) , you will be prompted with a FILE DOWNLOAD window, SAVE into the STYLES Folder of EndNote.

Be sure to make the both the FREE FULL TEXT and the PMC articles ELECTRONIC ARTICLE's in EndNote, the default is JOURNAL ARTICLE. You will need to include the URL in the URL field of the citation record in EndNote. Include today's date in the DATE ACCESSED field – the format is m/d/year where year must be four digits. The PMC # automatically populates the DOI field – as do two other items of information – the PII and the DOI. Cut the PII and the DOI from the DOI field and paste into the NOTES field – you never know when you might need this information later. In the DOI field, delete the initial spaces and hyphen and make sure that the letters PMC are in UPPER CASE.

If you are just pasting the PMCID into an existing citation record in an EndNote Library, insert it into the DOI field.

If you are importing totally new records from PubMed, use the PubMedpmc (NLM).enf for importing the citations and everything should go to the correct field.

The output style, VancouverPMC.ens, will create bibliographies according to NIH specifications if you have followed these directions.
