

## PubMed Enhancements affecting NIH submission

The National Library of Medicine has enhanced PubMed. These enhancements include, but are not limited to, Advanced Search, Save Search, Clipboard links, Related Articles links, Recent Activity, PMC Availability, etc. In addition, the icons which indicated whether an article had an abstract or not and whether it is available free and where it is available free have been removed.

The Advanced Search allows you to search for multiple fields simultaneously and to pre-limit your search. One of these Limits is Links to free full text. This is a “work-around” for determining whether an article is free outside of PMC. Please remember that Limits remain for eight hours unless removed.

With submission of information to NIH, it may be easier to provide URL's for all electronic articles and to fully follow publication styles for electronic articles.
