

## SUMMER SHORT-TERM STUDY ABROAD

3-CREDIT COURSES FOR UNDERGRADUATE AND  
GRADUATE STUDENTS.

### COURSE METHODS

These courses will consist of 40 contact hours over two or three weeks in country and will earn students 3 credit hours. Classes will meet four or five days a week, depending on the program. Saturday and Sunday will be free time for students

Teaching methods will include assigned readings, lectures, site visits, and other methods relevant to course content. The course director(s) will lead lectures and discussions, in addition to in-country lectures by internationally-recognized experts. Teaching will be interactive, rather than simply didactic. There will be small group exercises with specific assignments for each group.

### WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Courses are open to all undergraduate and graduate students.



### CANCELLATIONS

Students who wish to withdraw their applications are required to notify the Department of Bioethics **in writing** that they no longer intend to participate. Students who withdraw are still responsible for the deposit. Students who withdraw after travel arrangements have been made will be responsible for the total cost of cancelling those arrangements. A 10% administrative fee will be charged for cancellations made up to four weeks prior to the course. Cancellations thereafter will be liable for the entire program fee. Notice of cancellation **must** be given in writing.

The following items **are included** in the program fee:

The following items **are not included** in the program fee, but will need to be paid by participants:

Case Western Reserve University tuition and fees\*

- additional meals
- passport application fee

- pre-departure immunizations (if applicable)
- personal spending money
- reading materials
- airfare (unless otherwise noted)\*\*\*

**Tuition and fees\*:** These additional costs were estimated at \$748 per credit hour for undergraduate tuition and \$1375 per credit hour for graduates in Summer 2010. (Case Western Reserve University tuition is half price in the Summer for undergraduates.)

Students will receive an e-bill from the Case Western Reserve University Student Accounts Office, (addressed to their Case email account) for the **tuition and fees**. Again, tuition and fees are paid to CWRU and are separate from the **program fee** that is paid to the Department of Bioethics. The program fee for the course is paid directly to the Department of Bioethics.

## REGISTRATION

### HOW DO I APPLY?

Case Western Reserve University students should contact Michelle L. Champoir, [mln10@case.edu](mailto:mln10@case.edu), to set up an appointment to meet and turn in their paperwork and deposit. Case students will register for the class they choose via the SIS system after a permit has been issued.

**Non-Case students** should download the International Bioethics Program Application from our website and send it to the Department of Bioethics, along with the non-refundable \$250 deposit. Any inquiries should be directed to Michelle L. Champoir ([mln10@case.edu](mailto:mln10@case.edu)).

**Non-Case students** will also need to apply to Case Western Reserve University as visiting or non-degree students. Once they have been accepted, they will register for the class via the SIS system with the Case Network ID that will be issued to them upon their acceptance. Non-Case students will be billed for the tuition and fees through the Case Western Reserve University Bursar's office. The program fee paid to The Department of Bioethics for the cost of the course and travel is separate from the tuition and fees charged by Case Western Reserve University for the credit hours. The application and \$250 non-refundable deposit must be received in the Department of Bioethics by **April 1st for Summer programs**. We strongly recommend that you apply as soon as possible, as programs may fill to capacity prior to these deadlines.

**A \$250 non-refundable deposit is required.** Students are responsible for paying the remainder of the program fee prior to the trip. The deposit is applied to the cost of the program.
