

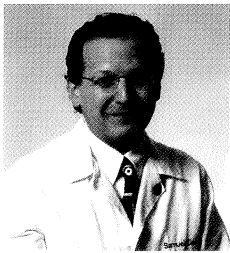

Speaker: Samuel Klein, M.D.

The Danforth Professor of Medicine and Nutritional Sciences
Washington University in St. Louis

Samuel Klein, M.D., is an internationally renowned expert on obesity and weight loss. Dr. Klein also is director of the Division of Geriatrics and Nutritional Sciences at the School of Medicine at Washington University. He directs that university's Center for Human Nutrition, and is associate program director of the university's General Clinical Research Center and medical director of both the Washington University Weight Management Center and the Barnes-Jewish Hospital Nutrition Support Service. Dr. Klein has developed several new clinical and research programs aimed at prevention and therapy for nutrition-related diseases. In his role with the Washington University Weight Management Center, Dr. Klein helps provide patients with long-term therapy for obesity. Current clinical research includes assessment of diet composition on weight loss and the regulation of fat metabolism in obesity.
