In accordance with Article VII, § 2(b)-(c) of the Case Western Reserve University School of Law Student Bar Association (SBA) Constitution (the "Constitution"), this report details the results from the Fall 2006 Student Bar Association Senatorial Election (the "Election"). The Election was held online for the first time via the Law School Intranet.

Article I, § 2 of the Constitution outlines the composition of the Student Bar Association Senate. The 1L class is to elect eight (8) Senators because that class was comprised of at two-hundred-thirty (230) law students as determined by the Law School registrar on the second Tuesday of September.<sup>1</sup> The LLM program is to elect one (1) Senator.<sup>2</sup> Additionally, a special election was held to fill one 3L Senate position due to the resignation of Senator Kurnik.<sup>3</sup>

In accordance with Article VII § 1(c) of the Constitution, the Election was held on Monday, September 18<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, September 19<sup>th</sup>. Votes were cast online. The Election Commission met at 9:15 p.m. on Tuesday, September 19<sup>th</sup> to review the vote count as produced by the website.

The winners were determined in accordance with Title III, Section 3.14 of the Student Bar Association Bylaws. In the 1L Senatorial election, the winners were the eight (8) persons who received the highest number of votes. In the LLM and 3L Senatorial elections, the winner was the person who received the highest number of votes. All persons who received a vote are listed on the following pages along with the number of votes he/she received.<sup>4</sup>
