He was in private practice in gastroenterology in Cleveland before joining the staff of the Department of Medicine at University Hospitals in 1966, where he remained for the next 24 years. Dr. Dworken joined the School of Medicine's faculty in 1952 as an assistant professor and later became a professor. He retired in 1990. In 1971 he served with Project Hope in Kingston, Jamaica. He was a visiting professor at the University of Guadalajara in 1974 and a visiting professor at the American Bureau for Medical Assistance to Taiwan, in 1990. In 1949 he married Natalie Klivans. They had two daughters and two grandchildren.

Gladys MacKay, 90 During World War II Mrs. MacKay was a member of the WAVES, a lieutenant in the U.S. Navy, and flew anti-submarine patrols, air-sea rescues and convoys. She taught communications at NTS Smith College, the Navy Base in Norfolk, the Third Naval District Headquarters and the Eastern Sea Frontier. Mrs. MacKay received her bachelor of science in home economics at Cornell University in 1936 and her master's degree from Teacher's College, Columbia University in 1940. She attended Case from 1948 to 1950, working on her doctorate. She taught at Cornell University Home

Economics Extension Service, rural and urban junior and senior high schools in Gilbertsville and Peekskill, N.Y., Mather College and Case. Survivors include her daughter, son, grandson, and niece. She was preceded in death by her husband, Dr. James MacKay; and daughter, Martha Ellen.
