Gertrude Donnelly Hess:
A PIONEER WITH QUIET COMMITMENT

She was a self-described maverick and a strong-willed pioneer. Through talent and determination, Gertrude Donnelly Hess—one of two women to graduate from the Western Reserve University School of Medicine in 1934—built a successful 40-year career as a doctor of family medicine in Cleveland.

Through it all, she kept her alma mater close to her heart. A widow with no children, Hess considered the students and faculty of the School of Medicine part of her family. When she died in January 2006, less than two months shy of her 102nd birthday, Hess made her final contribution to that university family: a \$5.7 million bequest—the largest bequest by a single donor in the School of Medicine’s history.

Hess’s generous commitment reflects a lifetime of focused work in support of her passion for medicine and research. After receiving her undergraduate degree in chemistry in 1926 from Flora Stone Mather College, a short stint as a medical technician at the Cleveland Clinic convinced Hess to become a doctor.

“I made up my mind, saved my money and made an application [to medical school]. I never regretted it and still have it in my blood,” Hess said in a 1999 interview.

After an internship and residency in Pittsburgh, she opened a family medicine practice at Kamm’s Corners, a neighborhood just west of Cleveland. Her early practice charges were \$2 per office visit, \$3 for house calls, \$5 for evening house calls and \$50 for baby deliveries. Nevertheless, she and her husband of 55 years, Gilbert Hess, were shrewd investors, and after her retirement in 1973, she began to give steadily to the School of Medicine.

“I am so thankful for her quiet support for the medical school through the years,” says Pamela Davis, M.D., dean of the School of Medicine. “Her dedication to her profession—especially to cancer research—was unwavering. That dedication, along with her deep passion for her medical school family, will help us continue to graduate extraordinary physicians for the future.”

Hess’s bequest will be used to establish the Gertrude Donnelly Hess, M.D., Endowed Fund for Oncology Research. The Gertrude Donnelly Hess, M.D., Chair for Research in Oncology that she established in 1999 in honor of her 65th reunion is currently held by Kurt C. Stange, M.D., Ph.D., professor of family medicine, epidemiology and biostatistics, and sociology and oncology and associate director of the Case Comprehensive Cancer Center.

obituaries

Earl F. Nation (MED '35) a urologist, died at his home in Sierra Madre, California on January 1, 2008, two weeks shy of his 98th birthday.

Born in Zephyr, Texas, Nation graduated with honors in chemistry from San Diego State College. His mentor there urged him to apply to the medical school at Western Reserve University. A residency in urology at the Los Angeles County Hospital was interrupted by tuberculosis, and during his two-year convalescence, Nation became an expert on the life and work of Sir William Osler, the influential Canadian physician. Health recovered, Nation joined a prominent urology group in Pasadena and in 1978 was elected president of the American Urological Association.

Nation wrote hundreds of essays about the history and culture of medicine. A memoir of his Depression-era medical student years appeared in the spring 2007 issue of *The Pharos*, journal of the Alpha Omega Alpha honor medical society. His last essay was published just a few weeks before his death. Nation had a great capacity for friendship, as evidenced by the large gathering at the celebration of his life held on March 2, 2008, in Pasadena.
